How does the INVOcell work?

- 1. Eggs and sperm are collected.
- 2. Sperm and eggs are placed in the inner chamber of the INVOcell.
- 3. The INVOcell is then placed into the vagina for 3-5 days to incubate and allow for in vivo fertilization to occur.
- 4. Once the incubation period is complete the INVOcell is removed and the embryos are evaluated under the microscope.
- 5. The highest quality embryos are chosen for same-day transfer. Any remaining embryos can be frozen for future use.

FIH is one of only a few IVF centers in the U.S. that is currently using Embryo Options for fertility patients. Those who wish to cryopreserve unused eggs, sperm and/or embryos for potential use in assisted reproductive treatment (ART) procedures are given access to a secure online portal. With Embryo Options, patients are able to make auto-payments for

storage, research disposition options and resources when the timing is appropriate, and have access to download complete informed consents or any other necessary paperwork.


BABY OF THE MONTH
