Fertility Preservation provides options for many people, including single women, men, same-sex couples, as well as those who may be going through any type of chemotherapy or radiation treatment. Fertility preservation involves a woman freezing her eggs or embryos (fertilized eggs) at a younger age in case she needs to use them at an older age when she is more likely to experience infertility. Men may choose to freeze sperm for various reasons as well, which could include cancer or overseas military orders, and the like. All preservation services are available here at FIH.


DONATING EMBRYOS

When couples go through in vitro fertilization and have decided that their family is complete, they sometimes have remaining embryos that are cryopreserved (frozen) in storage. Couples have a choice of:

- Donating for the purpose of embryo adoption.
- Donating for the purpose of quality assurance/research.
- Discarding in accordance with our policies.

Here at the Fertility Institute of Hawaii, we are one of only a few centers in the country to offer embryo adoption and donation. Donating embryos allows another family going though infertility to fulfill their dreams of becoming parents. FIH is currently one of only a few IVF centers in the U.S. that is currently using Embryo Options for fertility patients. Those who wish to cryopreserve unused eggs, sperm and/or embryos for potential use in assisted reproductive treatment (ART) procedures are given access to a secure online portal. With Embryo Options, patients are able to make autopayments for storage, research disposition options and resources when the timing is appropriate, and have access to download complete informed consents or any other necessary paperwork.
